This 2020 annual report is an opportunity to tell you, the community, where we have come from, what we have accomplished and where we plan to go. It also gives us the opportunity to thank each person, organization and municipal agency for your ongoing support.

The North Philadelphia Health System dba as The Behavioral Wellness Center at Girard is proud to be serving Philadelphia in its ____year. As many of you know we have not only survived, but are thriving after coming through bankruptcy in 2018. We solidified our contract with Community Behavioral Health, successfully negotiated and signed contracts with all four of our employee unions, and signed a 10 year lease with our landlord. We have successfully been able to re-establish ourselves as a financially stable organization that *inspires hope and transforms lives*. We do this through committed, compassionate evidence-based clinical care that is both spiritually and culturally sensitive.

To ensure it is the very best care, we have established a comprehensive training plan that is comprised of clinical, managerial and technical skills programs for all of our staff. We have embraced innovation by establishing a withdrawal management program with around the clock medical care provided by doctors, nurse practitioners, nurses and support staff. In addition, we have also begun same day induction, making sure Participants don't have to wait before being inducted and admitted. These programs have been initiated to support each client's initial choice to enter treatment a little easier. The Be Well Center has established partnerships to support the housing needs of our clients and is expanding alliances for the training of medical professionals in the discipline of addiction medicine on our campus. Our vision is of a network made up of community, organizations, government agencies and individuals all working together to ensure that the social determinants that affect us all, support the health of all.

Our board, executive team, physicians and our staff, all hold the vision for each of our Participants, of lives of sustainability and wellness; mentally, emotionally and physically. Over the years, our communities have faced many challenges and this year has been without precedent: opioids, COVID-19 and social unrest. Amidst all of this, The Behavioral Wellness Center focus is and will always be on keeping our Participants safe, cared for, and supported in creating productive, independent lives, no matter the circumstances. As important, is making sure that our staff, the caregivers, are also supported. They have the opportunity to use our new meditation room and participate in our burgeoning wellness program comprised of a new meditation app, tai chi, yoga and mindfulness, with more to come.

The Behavioral Wellness Center at Girard -Services

Inpatient Psychiatric Services

The Psychiatry Programs consist of acute, sub-acute and extended acute and services. Through the multidisciplinary team process, they provide a wide range of clinical services including diagnostic evaluation, medication, and coordination of general medical and psychiatric care in a therapeutic milieu. The Psychiatric Programs functions in consultation with the appointed case managers from the City of Philadelphia's Office of Mental Health in treatment planning and disposition, evaluation of therapeutic progress, goal planning, arranging for on-going appropriate after-care treatment and involvement in the community networking resources available. Services are provided by a multidisciplinary staff, within a highly structured treatment program.

Substance Use Disorder Services

Medicated Assisted Treatment

Medicated Assisted Treatment is available at all levels of care throughout the North Philadelphia Health System including, outpatient, intensive outpatient and non-hospital residential rehabilitation. Three types of medication are available to those seeking recovery from substance use disorders. As with all medications used in medication-assisted treatment (MAT), they are prescribed as part of a comprehensive treatment plan that includes counseling and participation in social support programs. Participants may choose to augment treatment with Methadone, Buprenorphine (Suboxone) or Vivitrol.

IOP/CAP Outpatient Program

The IOP/CAP Outpatient Program is a component of the Substance Use Disorder Programs of Girard Medical Center- the IOP/CAP Outpatient Program seeks to assist participants in establishing healthy behavioral alter natives to drug or alcohol seeking activity. It utilizes psychological support in a pleasant, relaxed atmosphere where the participant is treated with respect and dignity.

The Goldman Clinic

The Goldman Clinic is an outpatient and intensive outpatient program providing a wide range of opiate dependence /addiction education services and individual and group counseling with medication assisted treatment.

Residential /Inpatient Substance Use Disorder Services

The Residential Services of North Philadelphia Health Systems includes, (5) programs funded through Community Behavioral Health and one OMH grant funding program providing addiction services to residential participants. The programs are licensed or approved by the Department of Health, Division of Drug and Alcohol Program Licensure to provide hospital and non-hospital Addiction services. The Programs include:

Detoxification and Rehabilitation Unit
Torre De La Raza-Latino Men- and TDLR-Women Helping other Women (WHOW)
The Return Program I & Return Program II
Miracles in Progress I and II




